

STEP 1: IMPORTANT CONSIDERATIONS

Setting a Screening Date:

Our hope is for you to feel excited and at ease with planning your screening. Allow yourself 2-3 weeks to plan your event, secure a location, send out invitations, and allow guests to RSVP.

Your Target Audience:

Your film screening will be unique to you and is a meaningful way to create an impact in your community. We encourage you to consider why you're hosting your screening, who your target audience is, and what impact you want to leave them with. Setting a goal for your screening experience is a great way to provide direction and follow through with your vision.

How & Where?

Keeping in mind the above considerations, you'll want to decide if you'd like to opt for an in person screening, or a virtual screening.

In Person Screening:

When planning an in-person screening, it's important to consider who you will be inviting, how many people you're expecting, whether you intend to provide snacks, the expected weather, ideal location and so on.

Ideally, you want your venue to include the following amenities:

- Public parking
- · Wheelchair access
- Onsite seating available (if no seating- consider providing cushions, hay bales or encouraging attendees to bring their own pillows or blankets to sit on)
- · Visual and audio capabilities
- Bathroom facilities

When it comes to where you can host, the options are limitless. Keep in mind the size of your audience, and any COVID -19 social distancing considerations. When hosting an in-person screening we recommend you refer to the **CDC Guidelines** for updated information on hosting in-person gatherings during COVID-19.

Here's a few in-person locations we'd suggest:

- Someone's home or backvard*
 - *We encourage you to address and comply with the social distancing requirements of vour local aovernment
- · School auditorium or classroom
- · Local community center or garden
- Museum
- Your workplace
- Local farm

Netflix:

Netflix offers subscribers a great way to screen the film. If you do not already have a Netflix account, you can sign up **here** and receive a 30-day free trial. Please keep in mind that when sharing a Netflix film, there are legal guidelines and regulations to follow. Please learn more **here**.

Virtual Screening:

If you are hosting your event virtually, Netflix has added a **watch party** feature so you can watch along live with your friends and family. This is a great way to "come together" in community, if unable to meet in person.

STEP 2: HOSTING YOUR SCREENING

In addition to choosing between an online or in-person screening, you also have the option to host a **private or public event.** Hosting a private screening means this is only open to the guests you choose to invite. Hosting a public screening means we can support you by sharing your event with our network. As a host, you may share the event invitation with your community and we may also extend the invitation to the **Kiss the Ground Community**.

If you decide to host a public screening, here are some ways to get the word out:

- · Share with your community on Facebook and social media
- · Ask aligned organizations to share the event invitation in their newsletters
- Reach out to local community groups for them to extend invitations: community gardener groups, co-ops, farmers markets, local environmental groups, etc.

Screening Tools:

In order to host your event, you will need to have access to a few items:

To host an in-person screening:

- · 1 projector (backyard option where applicable)
- · A table for the projector
- · A large screen or large TV with table
- · 1 Computer with Internet access
- 1 HDMI cord
- · Chairs or blankets, for outdoor venues

To host a virtual screening:

- · Where to access the film: Netflix
- · Resource for setting up a computer or TV with an HDMI: instructions here

Other Considerations:

Refreshments: Will you be offering food or beverages at your screening? Let the regenerative theme continue with the food on your plate!

Discussion Ouestions:

We know that connecting with your community is important, so we're happy to offer you a way to engage with others in conversation after watching the film. We recognize that everyone processes differently. The film was only able to cover some parts of the story and there is so much more to discover!

Once the film is over, it's helpful to allow for a safe space for everyone to take a moment to reflect. Depending on the size of your audience, you can transition to this space by inviting your audience to reflect on their own or engaging them in a group activity in person or online depending how you show your screening. For smaller audiences, we recommend participating all together and for larger audiences we recommend dividing into groups of 2-4 participants.
